Marking Rachel Jones's first contemporary solo show, *Gated Canyons*, in the Dulwich Picture Gallery's main space, is highly anticipated. THERE'S A TIME AND A PLACE

Acclaimed Bangladeshi architect and educator Marina Tabassum and her firm Marina Tabassum Architects (TBA), has designed *A Capsule in Time* for the 2025 Pavillion in the Serpentine Gallery.
